

STERLING HOMES EDMONTON COMMITS TO

SUSTAINABILITY WITH BUILT GREEN CERTIFICATION

EDMONTON, AB – Sterling Homes Edmonton has become a BUILT GREEN certified homebuilder, earning recognition for building more sustainable, more affordable, and healthier homes. The builder has earned the certification on one home so far, receiving the Platinum level—BUILT GREEN's highest certification.

The home that earned Sterling Homes Edmonton its first BUILT GREEN certification is 20% more energy efficient than a typical home and uses 87 GJ/year compared to the 118 GJ/year used by the program's reference house.

BUILT GREEN is a national industry-driven nonprofit organization that works with residential builders who are interested in responsible sustainability practices. It offers a variety of programs and learning opportunities, as well as third-party certification that verifies the energy performance and green features integrated into a home.

Sterling Homes Edmonton plans to apply for certification on all front attached and rear attached garage homes in the near future.

Kensington Homes employees had access to promotional gear like shirts and jackets that featured the special 50th anniversary logo to help them celebrate the company's major milestone.




FOXRIDGE HOMES BC USES DRONES TO **BRING HOME INSPECTIONS** TO THE NEXT LEVEL

VANCOUVER, BC - Foxridge Homes BC has reimagined how they complete home inspections, making the process safer and more efficient with the use of drones.

The innovative method means orientation specialists can safely look for any issues with roofing shingles, fascia board joints, roofing vents, and pipe flashing from the ground. Deficiencies that have been uncovered can be communicated to site staff to ensure the issues are resolved before a customer moves into their new home.

Since implementing drone inspections on all new homes in February, Foxridge Homes BC has used the inspection method on dozens of homes.

the safety of staff is the number one priority, closely followed by customer satisfaction. Anything the homebuilder can do to streamline, improve is on the table. Newer technologies can always be incorporated into a process and the use of drone inspections is a great example of this.

MILESTONES AND RECOGNITION IN 2022

AUSTIN AND DALLAS-FORT WORTH, TX -

Pacesetter Homes Texas earned its highest ranking so far on Builder Magazine's Builder 100 list, which highlights US homebuilders with the highest number of closings each year.


The homebuilder climbed to 76th on 2022's list, six spots higher than last year, with 844 closings in 2021. Pacesetter Homes Texas officially made the list for the first time in 2017 at #91 and has continued to make its way up the rankings each year.

As well, Pacesetter Homes Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW) reached an impressive milestone in 2022, marking 500 closings since the business unit opened in 2018. Often known as a possession, a closing occurs when a home is delivered to the purchaser and the title is transferred.

This milestone is significant when looking at Pacesetter Homes DFW's growth over the past several years in a market that has, at times, presented some unique challenges.









PACESETTER HOMES SASKATCHEWAN TAKES HOME SECOND ENVIRONMENTAL LEADERSHIP AWARD

REGINA, SK - Pacesetter Homes Saskatchewan solidified its reputation for building energy-efficient homes by winning the Environmental Leadership Award (20+ homes), presented by the Regina Home Builders' Association.

This latest win marks the second consecutive time the homebuilder has won the award. While Pacesetter Homes Saskatchewan designs and constructs homes to be over 20% better than the current building code on average, the home that won the 2022 award was built to be 40% more efficient compared to the code standards.

This incremental increase is intended to work towards the Canadian climate change action plan, which calls for net-zero home code requirements, and Pacesetter Homes Saskatchewan plans to build more net-zero ready homes in the near future as part of that goal. This is also driven by energy efficiency being a more frequent consideration that homebuyers are weighing in the province.

ELEVATES HOMEOWNER EXPERIENCE WITH CUSTOM ART



FOXRIDGE HOMES BC TAKES HOME MULTIPLE AWARDS IN 2022



brand-new suppliers to the mix specifically for these builds. The builder's marketing team has also been working on how to package and present these quick-possession homes to customers. This innovative program is a great example

of solving a business challenge and capitalizing on a business opportunity.


LAUNCHES PREPLANNED LEGAL BASEMENT SUITES


Qualico has earned a reputation for market leadership. Qualico's multifamily projects are built on this legacy.

Our multi-family vertical builds apartment-style, townhome-style, detached-home, and luxury condominiums throughout Western Canada.

With projects that range from innovative urban developments to historic retrofits to lifestyle communities, we provide a range of solutions for homeownership. With a focus on quality, value, energy-efficiency, and service, we are passionate about building lasting relationships with our customers and our suppliers.









To keep condo fees down for homeowners, each unit is metered for its own power, heat, and gas and each has its own self-contained HVAC unit, so the only utility owners share is water.



Studio, one-bedroom, and two-bedroom units are available, with some of the units coming in at under 500 sq. ft. and prices starting at just \$125,000. The goal was to keep costs low to fill a gap in the market for buyers looking for the perfect combination of quality and affordability.

MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT TO SOAR ABOVE SURREY'S CITY CENTRE

SURREY, BC – Juno, StreetSide Developments BC's first mixed-use high-rise, is set to break ground on the outer edge of Surrey's newly established Business District, creating exciting new housing options for residents of Metro Vancouver's fastest-growing municipality.

Towering 33 storeys above Surrey's skyline once completed, Juno will offer 341 spacious condominiums with a variety of floorplans including one-bedroom to three-bedroom suites, studio units, and a new smart lock-off option that opens a host of lifestyle and rental possibilities for new condo buyers.

Amenities will include beautifully landscaped outdoor gathering areas, a playground, a kids' gaming area, a rooftop lounge, a family lounge, a theatre room, co-working space, a wellness centre, and six levels of underground parking. The building's location also allows for convenient access to public transit, as well as schools, parks, a hospital, shopping, and restaurants.

Presales are planned to start mid-2023 followed by construction.







MULTI-FAMILY HOMES 2022 HIGHLIGHTS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS



BEGINS FINAL PHASE OF EVANSTON PARK

CALGARY, AB – StreetSide Developments
Calgary has started construction and presales
for Evanston Park's fourth and final phase,
adding 79 modern saltbox-style townhomes to
the well-established Evanston community in
Northwest Calgary.

Marking the final stage of a multi-phased project nearly a decade in the making, the new

homes will be ready for occupancy in summer 2023 and offer affordable contemporary living with all the amenities and conveniences of a fully established neighbourhood.

The three-level walk-up townhomes will offer a variety of three-bedroom to four-bedroom floorplans ranging from 1,165 to 1,572 sq. ft. Once completed, the project will add 13 new multi-family buildings and bring the total number of townhome units in Evanston Park to 238.

Unlike with the previous three phases at Evanston Park, StreetSide Developments opted for larger floorplans this time around to appeal to families needing plenty of space, but for whom the affordability of a single-family home may be out of reach.





OAK + ASH CONDOS SEE HIGH DEMAND

WINNIPEG, MB - StreetSide Developments Winnipeg's Oak + Ash bungalow condominium development is officially sold out, with the first possessions having taken place in October 2022. The 23-unit development is located along the west edge of the city in The Oaks community.

Oak + Ash stands out as an in-demand product because bungalow condos are currently not widely available in Winnipeg and tend to be very appealing for the city's aging demographic. StreetSide Developments Winnipeg wanted to offer the most appropriate style of bungalows and find the right balance for an easy option to transition to condo living from a larger home. With this in mind, the builder landed on a single-detached with double garage offering.

Oak + Ash offered the chance for homebuyers to customize their finishes and select upgrades pre-construction. The development's location is also appealing, being in a more natural setting, yet close to many amenities.

StreetSide Developments is contributing a portion of the landscaping, native planting, and construction work for the site, including a new walking path that allows residents to explore the area while protecting the delicate natural ecosystem surrounding it.

NEW CONDO DEVELOPMENT, BAILEY, COMING TO VANCOUVER

VANCOUVER. BC - StreetSide Developments BC has announced that a new six-storey condominium project called Bailey is slated for construction in Vancouver's bustling Little Mountain community.

The project marks the multi-family homebuilder's first major foray into the Vancouver market.

The new 61-unit low-rise development will feature floorplans that range from studios to threebedroom + flex homes, ranging in size from 452 to 1,098 sq. ft. The three-bedroom + flex home units will allow residents to convert a large integrated storage area into a den or walk-in pantry.

A range of amenities will be included in the development, including eco-friendly ones such as electric bicycle charging ports and EV-ready parking spaces. With Bailey, the builder is also hoping to achieve one of the highest energy-efficient targets possible.

Presales for Bailey will begin in early 2023, with construction expected to begin later in the year.




SETS PRE-SALE RECORD WITH LUXURY CONDO PROJECT

WINNIPEG, MB - StreetSide Developments Winnipeg has set the record for presales for any apartment-style condominium project for the business unit to date with its Vue Taché project, situated in a prime location in Winnipeg's North St. Boniface neighbourhood. The project is StreetSide Developments' fifth apartment-style condominium development in the area.

Over 90% of the project's 87 units have already sold and possessions are expected to start in summer 2023. Once completed, the seven-storey, luxury concrete building will offer one- to three-bedroom condominiums ranging from 786 to 1,868 sq. ft.

For the Vue Taché project, the StreetSide Developments Winnipeg team addressed new market demands, including features such as large-spanning windows and expansive kitchen layouts, to provide customers a new level of luxury in a highly desirable neighbourhood. Considering the high degree of customization and many available upgrades, the project's presale record is impressive in relation to its high-end price point.









WINS BEST COMMUNITY FOR FIFTH TIME

CALGARY, AB – For the fifth time since opening in 2015, Harmony was awarded the Best Community in the Calgary Region at the 2021 Building Industry Land Development (BILD) Awards. Located in Rocky View County, on the western edge of the city, the 1,753-acre development is the largest community housing project ever undertaken by Qualico Communities Calgary.

Featuring the best in lake-style living, innovative amenities, sophisticated housing options, and wellplanned connectivity, Harmony is raising the bar in Alberta for new developments that focus on lifestyle and the community experience. With two large freshwater lakes, sand beaches, a world-class golf course, 25 km of trails, parks, and entertainment, the community offers residents an extraordinary wealth of things to do and experience.

Other amenities will include a Village Centre—with shops, restaurants, and a wellness spa—as well as a new school. Once fully built, the community will be home to 10,000 to 12,000 residents.

COMMUNITY TOUR FOR NEW DEVELOPMENT, BISON RUN

WINNIPEG, MB - Qualico Communities Winnipeg has started work on servicing for Phase 2 of its Bison Run community, located in southwest Winnipeg's Waverley West neighbourhood, one of Winnipeg's fastest growing areas.

A community tour event to mark the start of Phase 2 took place on Oct. 20, 2022, with city councillor Janice Lukes in attendance, along with Bryan Ward, Vice-President, Qualico Communities Winnipeg and David Eggerman, Regional Vice-President, Manitoba & Saskatchewan.

Servicing for Phase 1 of the project has been completed, and that phase will include a mix of custom and premium single-family homes, as well as multi-family buildings. There will also be some commercial development in Phase 1, as well as a school site.

The first showhomes in the community opened in the winter of 2022, with all nine being open for the Spring Parade of Homes in February 2023.


LAUNCHES NEW COMMUNITY IN LANGDON, PAINTED SKY

CALGARY, AB - In 2022, Qualico Communities Calgary announced the launch of Painted Sky, its newest development in the hamlet of Lanadon. located 20 minutes from Calgary at the east end of Glenmore Trail.

The business unit broke ground on the new community in 2020, which will be built over 266 acres in nine phases. Homebuilders in Painted Sky's Phase 1 began selling to the public in the spring of 2022, and showhomes opened in the fall of 2022.

For the first time, Qualico Communities Calgary included exclusive Qualico homebuilders in Phase 1. This allowed Qualico Communities the ability to offer incentives from Qualico exclusive partners to new homebuyers through its First 30 Incentive Program.

Along with larger lot sizes and diverse home styles, Painted Sky will include great amenities once completed, including 2.8 km of pathways, four playgrounds, six parks, and wetland areas.





QUALICO CELEBRATES GRAND OPENING OF EDMONTON'S FIRST MAJOR ROADWAY NAMED IN CREE

EDMONTON, AB – Qualico Communities Edmonton celebrated National Indigenous Peoples Day with the grand opening of Maskêkosihk Trail, Edmonton's first major roadway to be named in honour of the

Cree First Nations.

The 2-km roadway was renamed in 2016, where Qualico Communities is building two new communities in the Riverview development: The Uplands at Riverview and Rivers Edge. Maskêkosihk is the Cree word meaning the "lands of medicines" or "the people of the lands of medicines," depending on how you say it.

The event began with a Treaty 6 land acknowledgment, a blessing by Cree Elder Marvin Ward, and included performances by the River Cree Drummers and Maskêkosihk Dancers. Dignitaries attending the event included Chief Billy Morin and other leaders from the Enoch Cree Nation, as well as Edmonton Mayor Amarjeet Sohi, Councillor Sarah Hamilton, and many contractors, consultants, and staff who participated in the development project.

AUSTIN, TX - Qualico Communities Austin is now servicing lots in Phases 2, 4 and 5 of its Manor Commons development in Manor, Texas, east of the city of Austin.

The Manor Commons development involves a new ownership structure for Qualico Communities Austin, with the business unit partnering with Chesmar Homes to split the lots 50/50, and Qualico acting as development manager.

Phase 1 of the development had already been completed by the previous owner/developer. Phases 2 to 5 of the development will include 276 singlefamily lots, and the development is expected to be completed in early 2024.

Manor Commons is a great example of the work Qualico Communities Austin is doing to expand Qualico's reach in the Austin area and beyond, and create ongoing opportunities for Qualico homebuilders.

QUALICO COMMUNITIES BC

HITS SERVICING PROJECT MILESTONES IN THE BROOKSWOOD **COMMUNITY IN LANGLEY**

LANGLEY, BC - Qualico Communities BC is completing servicing projects for its development in the Brookswood community in Langley, including an extensive 3-km sanitary sewer line that connects to nearby infrastructure and an innovative stormwater detention solution.

The new sanitary sewer line will service the planned 84-lot Qualico Communities BC project in Brookswood, but secondary community and environmental benefits include dozens of existing properties now having the ability to connect into the new sewer infrastructure instead of relying on septic fields.

The completed stormwater detention facility is a result of successful collaboration between Qualico Communities BC, the Township of Langley, and the Province of BC. The ideal location for a stormwater pond was identified to be on a provincially-owned park that the Township of Langley leases from the Province.

The innovative approach saw the Qualico Communities team leverage a natural existing ground depression and creek outlet. By augmenting the natural landscape versus dredging an artificial secondary pond, the stormwater management solution blends naturally into the existing park space and greenways that residents currently use for recreation and walking paths.





QUALICO COMMUNITIES DALLAS-FORT WORTH SEES GROWTH IN 2022

DALLAS-FORT WORTH, TX – Since launching operations in 2021, Qualico Communities Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW) has made considerable headway into one of America's top housing markets.

Through strategic partnerships, a series of land purchases, ongoing land development, and the region's impressive job creation numbers and ability to attract high-income earners from across the US, the DFW business unit is capitalizing on strong demand and record housing starts.







Focusing on strategic land planning, Qualico Communities DFW works with municipal and county governments, as well as professional homebuilders, to develop residential communities that appeal to homebuyers in the area.

In 2022, Qualico Communities DFW initiated development in three master-planned communities, including Nelson Lake in Rockwall, Elevon in Lavon, and La Terra in Celina, with Pacesetter Homes and other builders. 








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QUALICO PROPERTIES CELEBRATES

GROUNDBREAKING OF DOWNTOWN EDMONTON'S STATION LANDS

EDMONTON, AB – City and community leaders gathered to mark the beginning of construction of Station Lands, Edmonton's first master-planned community in the city's downtown. The development is expected to attract new businesses and thousands of residents to the downtown core and positively affect Chinatown and the surrounding area.

Qualico Properties, the developer of Station Lands, designed the community to become a transformational space in the heart of Edmonton.







The groundbreaking event began with Treaty 6 acknowledgments made by Elder Clifford Cardinal and a performance by the Chubby Cree Dance Group. Other dignitaries in attendance included Edmonton Mayor Amarjeet Sohi and Edmonton-City Centre MLA David Shepherd.

The project's anticipated opening is in 2024, and once complete, it will provide over 600 residential units, as well as commercial spaces and family-friendly public spaces.



QUALICO PROPERTIES TO BUILD

TWO HIGH-PROFILE DISTRIBUTION **CENTRES IN EDMONTON**

EDMONTON, AB - Qualico Properties will have 630,000 sq. ft. of industrial space under development in Edmonton in 2023 thanks to two upcoming largescale distribution centre projects.

The distribution centres, one for The Brick and the other for Home Depot, represent tremendous growth within Edmonton's light industrial real estate market in recent years and are some of the biggest industrial deals that Edmonton has seen.

Working closely with both retailers to understand their requirements, Qualico Properties was able to provide a tailored response to specifically meet their needs. The business unit utilized expertise from its development, leasing, and property management divisions, which speaks to the strength of its unified approach.



Qualico Properties announced a 50/50 joint venture with The Brick's parent company, Leon's (LFL Group), Canada's largest furniture, appliance, and electronics retailer, to develop a new distribution centre and corporate office for The Brick in Edmonton.

Slated to be completed in 2024, the 500,000-sq.-ft. facility will be built on 28 acres of land in Qualico's North 170 Henday Business Park. It will replace the existing 365,000-sq.-ft. distribution centre.

The Home Depot distribution centre, located in Acheson, is being built on 15 acres and will be a total of 206,600 sq. ft. once completed.







QUALICO PROPERTIES AND STREETSIDE DEVELOPMENTS BC

LEVERAGE THEIR STRENGTHS FOR NEW MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT

BURNABY, BC – StreetSide Developments BC and Qualico Properties are teaming up to ensure the success of a new mixed-use development in Burnaby.

Valeo in the Burnaby Heights neighbourhood will be a two-building, five-storey project that, once completed, will have 62 residential strata units, a ground-level retail/commercial component, and office space. The residential component of the project is already sold out and the completion date of the entire project is expected in the fall of 2024.

The commercial side of things is where StreetSide Developments BC and Qualico Properties are collaborating, with Qualico Properties negotiating the leases with prospective commercial tenants on the ground level of Valeo on behalf of StreetSide Developments. Once the commercial leases are finalized, Properties will hand the commercial component over to StreetSide Developments to manage.



QUALICO PROPERTIES' NEWEST ASSET WILL BE LEASED FOR THE

NEW CALGARY REGIONAL OFFICE AND OTHER TENANTS



CALGARY, AB – Qualico Properties has acquired a three-storey, 98,225-sq.-ft. building in South Calgary's Quarry Park that will serve as the Southern Alberta Region's new main office and as a new asset in the business unit's portfolio that offers leasing potential.

The building is undergoing renovations and multiple Qualico business units will be moving into the top two floors and a small section of the main floor sometime in mid-2023.

Renovation activities are underway, which include plans to lease the main floor to other tenants. Marketing for external tenants has already begun, with tenants anticipated to be moving in by late 2023.

Along with a LEED Certified core and shell, the building also offers underground parking and is in a high-traffic area of Calgary with many desirable amenities nearby.





QUALICO US JOINT-VENTURE MERCHANT-BUILDING

PROJECTS SEE GRAND OPENINGS, **NEW STAGES AND UPCOMING STARTS**

Shoreline Gateway, the 35-storey luxury apartment building in Long Beach, California developed via joint-venture partners and Qualico, officially opened spring of 2022. The partners held a grand opening ceremony on Shoreline Gateway's rooftop to celebrate the completion of what is now the tallest building in Long Beach. Along with luxury apartments, Shoreline Gateway features a variety of amenities, community spaces, and approximately 6,500 sq. ft. of commercial space. The building is currently over 80% leased.

Out in Texas, another of Qualico's joint-venture projects is nearing completion. Starlight, a five-storey mixed-use building located in East Austin, is expected to be completed in January 2023 and pre-leasing has begun. Once completed, the building will include 325 apartment units, underground parking, and groundlevel retail and restaurant space.

Two other new joint-venture merchant-building projects Qualico is working on in California are Canyon Bluffs in Riverside, an 88-unit development that will include three-storey garden-style buildings with detached garages and carports. Construction on Canyon Bluffs is expected to start in January 2023. The second project is Sunny Creek in Carlsbad, which will include 212 apartment units. Construction is expected to start in August 2023.



The new-completed second phase of the Hercules Bayfront development between Qualico and joint-venture partners, called The Grand, is currently over 60% leased, and the start of the next phase of the development will be dependent on market conditions. The upcoming 267-unit project will be called The Mint.









AT EDGEMONT LANDING COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT

EDMONTON, AB – Qualico Properties' Edgemont Landing commercial development in the Southwest Edmonton Edgemont neighbourhood is bringing in-demand retailers and service providers to residents living in this rapidly growing area.

Three buildings have been completed and leased so far on the 9.8-acre site and Qualico Properties is now in the process of completing a building lease for Sobeys, which will be the anchor tenant for Edgemont Landing. Once that has been completed, construction of the remaining five buildings will commence in spring of 2023, and the goal is to have the remaining buildings fully leased within a year.



With over 91,000 sq. ft. of commercial space at full build-out, Edgemont Landing is set to provide convenient and attractive options for shopping, health, and dining needs to the residents of Edgemont and the nearby community of The Hamptons.

RANCHO WINNIPEG IMPLEMENTS

NEW TENANT PORTAL SYSTEM TO INCREASE EFFICIENCY AND ACCESSIBILITY





WINNIPEG, MB - Rancho Winnipeg has implemented a new tenant portal system called RentCafe that will help the team handle online applications and manage potential and long-term tenants more efficiently.

The three-point portal system is an extension of the Yardi Property Management System that the Rancho Winnipeg team currently uses and includes a Prospect Portal, a Resident Portal, and a Master/Main Portal that hosts a marketing platform called RentCafe.

RentCafe's Prospect Portal helps Rancho Winnipeg attract prospective tenants and convert them into applicants faster, dramatically reducing the time required to bring on new tenants. The Resident Portal can be accessed through a mobile app and allows current tenants to manage their information, make requests, and make payments more conveniently. It's also an efficient way for Rancho Winnipeg to communicate with many tenants at once.














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THE FLOOR SHOW BECOMES FIRST CANADIAN

PARTNER OF TARKETT'S PREMIERE FLOORING RECYCLING PROGRAM

WINNIPEG, MB – The Floor Show has established a partnership with Paris-based world leader in flooring and sports surface solutions, Tarkett, becoming one of the first of Tarkett's recycling allies in its premiere flooring recycling program called ReStart.

Through the ReStart program, excess flooring that is not used at the end of a build is returned to Tarkett's facilities and turned into high-quality raw material to produce brand new flooring. The program also prevents cut-offs from ending up in the landfill or incinerator. The Floor Show carries a wide variety of Tarkett products, making them an ideal partner for the program. The program also fits well with Qualico's goal of building sustainably.

As an example of the recycling potential, The Floor Show participated in a project at the Selkirk Regional Health Centre in Manitoba that recycled 6,978 lbs of Tarkett product offcuts from the install process. On three projects since 2018, The Floor Show has collected and recycled 22,000 lbs of flooring through Tarkett's ReStart program.













EMPIRE DRYWALL

TAKES ON MAJOR JUSTICE CENTRE PROJECT IN RED DEER, AB

RED DEER, AB - Empire Drywall is working on the new \$207-million Red Deer Justice Centre located in the city's downtown, which will replace the older courthouse that is currently at capacity. Empire Drywall has taken on more scopes than any other trades involved in the project, including exterior framing and sheathing, wood backing install, interior framing, insulation, drywall, and taping.

Once completed, the Justice Centre will be 312,000 sq. ft. and nine storeys with 18-ft. ceilings per storey, making it closer in size to a standard 18-storey building. It will feature 12 courtrooms, with room for future expansion to 16 courtrooms.

The project is Empire Drywall's third-largest in its more than 50-year history, its largest since 2020, and its only project in Red Deer. Despite facing many labour, supply, and cost challenges related to the pandemic, the large team of about 85 workers is keeping things on track for timely completion.



QUALICO ATTENDS GRAND OPENING

EVENT FOR DONATED BUILDING AT OAK HAMMOCK MARSH

WINNIPEG, MB - The official grand opening of the Willow Retreat at Ducks Unlimited Canada's Harry J. Enns Wetland Discovery Centre took place in July at the Centre's Oak Hammock Marsh location.

The Willow Retreat is a modified ready-tomove home built by Star Ready To Move Homes Winnipeg and donated by Qualico as a gift-in-kind donation worth nearly \$250,000. The building will be used for a variety of activities, including yearround educational programming for youth, specialty group workshops, as well as private functions, meetings, and gatherings.


WALL PANELING BUSINESS OFFERS EFFICIENCY AND WASTE MANAGEMENT BENEFITS

CALGARY, AB – Star Building Materials Calgary has acquired wall paneling equipment that not only helps diversify the business unit's offerings, but has also led to waste management, efficiency, and cost-effectiveness benefits.


Part of the appeal of using panels is the efficiency involved. Unlike lumber, which may end up being moved to various jobsites or used for unintended purposes, panels are made and shipped out to the jobsite, where they are used for a specific purpose.

Since the panels are delivered to the jobsite already completed, there's less risk of material waste, less mess on the jobsite, and a cost savings related to faster and more efficient builds. Cleaner jobsites also reflect well on the builder, both during and after construction.

Star Building Materials Calgary plans to continue to expand its client base for the wall paneling business, both in the single-family and multi-family arenas.

FINDS REVENUE IN SUSTAINABILITY

WINNIPEG, MB - In the residential construction market, the price of lumber directly impacts the cost of building and purchasing a new home. For major lumber and construction material suppliers like Star Building Materials, keeping costs down requires innovation and making the most of valuable resources.

To cut costs and prevent any culled wood and by-products from entering a landfill, Star Building Materials tries to repurpose virtually every grain of discarded wood, selling it at discounted prices to certain customers. The tiniest scraps are even sold for use as biofuels, or in some cases, ground into sawdust and sold. Any leftover wood in the yard at the end of the month is sold as firewood.

To minimize the volume of scrap, Star Building Materials uses a sophisticated automated saw from MiTek that makes precise cuts while maximizing each lift of wood to produce the least amount of waste possible.





DESIGNO DONATIONS ASSIST LOCAL CHARITIES

AND KEEP FURNISHINGS OUT OF WINNIPEG LANDFILL

WINNIPEG, MB - While centralizing its warehouse last year, designQ Winnipeg sorted through showhome staging items it no longer needed and donated eight truckloads of those items to four local non-profit organizations that could benefit from them

The charities included Resource Assistance for Youth (RAY), women and children's shelter Willow Place, Hockey Helps the Homeless, and Habitat for Humanity. Furniture, beds, lamps, linens, bedding, and small home accessories were donated to the charities, with

bedding and small accessories sent to Willow Place, and larger furnishings and accessories sent to the other organizations.

These donations align with Qualico's commitment to corporate responsibility, and giving the unneeded items a new life also ensures there is less waste ending up in landfills while supporting the important work of local non-profit organizations that provide resources to individuals in need





BP CONCRETE TACKLES

MAJOR PROJECTS IN 2022

WINNIPEG & ST. ANDREWS, MB – Building Products & Concrete Supply (BP Concrete) worked on two major projects in 2022 that showcased their scale, scope and expertise in their field.

The 22-storey Wawanesa Tower in downtown Winnipeg required 33 different concrete mixes for different parts of the structure to accommodate requirements such as freeze/thaw cycles in the underground parkade, decreased setting time and increased turnaround for slabs, sulphate-resistance for concrete in the ground, and increased strength and a smaller footprint for columns.

BP Concrete also builds sustainability into all of its mix designs. In its own lab, the company performs 10 to 12 tests per day on all concrete to ensure strengths are being met and strength requirements

aren't exceeded. If they are, decreasing the cement content can reduce the carbon footprint and the usage of cement.

The BP Concrete team was also hard at work on the lock and dam upgrade in St. Andrews, Manitoba this year—a project that will make the well-used route through the town safer and more efficient. This federal project has required meticulous strategic planning to ensure that interruption to the bridge's use is kept to a minimum during construction; tighter engineering specifications, rules, and mix parameters; as well as exacting temperature specifications for the concrete itself.

The concrete mix used in this project includes fly ash, a powdered coal byproduct, which produces better strength-producing properties and increases the sulphate resistance throughout the mix. This can help with longer-term performance. Fly ash also has environmental benefits because it's a recycled product that can replace a certain percentage of the cement, helping to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Both the Wawanesa Tower building and St. Andrews lock and dam upgrade projects are slated for completion in 2023.

\$1 MILLION TO HELP SUPPORT THOSE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IN EDMONTON

EDMONTON, AB - A \$1-million donation provided by Station Lands, a partnership between Qualico and Ledcor, along with funds from other donors has helped Boyle Street Community Services (BSCS) achieve 75% of its fundraising goal for a new facility that will support those experiencing homelessness.

The new centre will allow BSCS to better serve the more than 12,000 people they assist annually. The \$28.5-million state-of-the-art centre will replace the organization's existing aging facility.

Named 'Okimaw Peyesew Kamik', which translates to King Thunderbird Centre, the centre will facilitate a better approach to supporting Edmontonians who are experiencing chronic homelessness and ensure

their basic needs are met. The new facility will also enable BSCS to address the root causes of chronic homelessness more proactively, while providing for the immediate needs of those who rely on the organization's support.









HELPS SUPPORT KA NI KANICHIHK EXPANSION PROJECT

WINNIPEG, MB – Ka Ni Kanichihk is planning an expansion of its facility at 455 McDermot Ave. with the support of government and private donors, including a \$500,000 donation from Qualico.

Ka Ni Kanichihk opened in 2001 and offers Indigenous-designed and led programs and services. About 1,500 Indigenous Manitobans access programs through Ka Ni Kanichihk every year.

The planned \$8-million facility expansion will see Ka Ni Kanichihk grow to over 20,000 sq. ft. with

the capacity to provide access to programs for around 3,000 Indigenous Manitobans annually.

The new building will be home to unique public spaces for the community, including an expanded daycare; a dedicated cultural gathering space; wellness and healing spaces; a community kitchen; a resource hub for youth; training and education rooms; and a neighbourhood outdoor gathering place and butterfly garden.

Work on the expansion is expected to begin in early 2023.







QUALICO CELEBRATES EARTH DAY BY COLLECTING ALMOST

300 CUBIC FEET OF E-WASTE FROM ACROSS THE COMPANY

To celebrate Earth Day at Qualico, the IT departments across all regions hosted an e-waste recycling day to collect any e-waste from employees to ensure it was properly recycled. E-waste can be extremely harmful, as over time it can leak toxic elements such as mercury and lead, which can be destructive to the environment, as well as wildlife and humans alike.

Qualico's IT department collects and recycles company-generated e-waste, but through the Earth Day e-waste initiative,

employees were invited to bring in their own household e-waste to be recycled.

The total volume of e-waste collected

Qualico-wide during the first-ever e-waste Earth Day initiative was approximately 290.5 cu. ft. Aside from common items, some relics that were photographed by IT team members who were onsite during the pick-up day included a folding transparency projector from 2000, many old computers and cell phones, and even a fax machine.





Qualico's Acts of Kindness program operates year-round in our regions, encouraging employees to give back to our communities and the causes they care about. Qualico employees can submit an Acts of Kindness application for a charity or not-for-profit organization to receive a \$1,000 donation. With over seven years of kindness being advocated by Qualico employees, over \$375,000 has been donated to communities in which Qualico operates.

DONATION ASSISTS WITH PURCHASE OF AQUATIC SEARCH AND RECOVERY EQUIPMENT

WINNIPEG, MB - Qualico's \$1,000 Acts of Kindness donation to HEART (Hutterian Emergency Aquatic Response Team) was used to help the non-profit aquatic rescue and recovery team purchase brand new, advanced aquatic equipment to further assist in their recoveries.

HEART, officially founded in April 2016, is a small team of skilled divers who recover families' loved ones from waterways around Manitoba, as well as in places as far west as BC, as far east as Ontario, and as far north as Nunavut.

DONATION HELPS THE ROYAL ALEXANDRA HOSPITAL CARE FOR VULNERABLE NEWBORNS



EDMONTON, AB – Thanks to a Qualico Acts of Kindness donation, the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at the Royal Alexandra Hospital received a boost to its funding in 2022 to provide care for premature or critically ill newborns and support for their families.

Qualico's donation was used towards acquiring a transcutaneous bilirubinometer to screen newborns for jaundice in a non-invasive way, as well as several state-of-the-art Nära bassinets to keep babies and their mothers close during a vulnerable time.

These full-circle examples encourage employees to continue their participation in this highly successful employee-directed giving program.
